# **Screen Time**

I have become concerned this week to hear about the amount of screen time that some of our children are exposed to on a daily basis. Screen time refers to any time looking at a screen, and research suggests that excessive screen time can lead to:

- Poor sleeping patterns
- Attention span problems
- Delays in language development
- Delays in the development of social skills

With screens virtually everywhere, monitoring a child's screen time can be challenging, especially as, to complicate matters, some screen time can be educational.

With the above in mind, the NHS and the National Institute of Clinical Excellence (NICE) recommend an upper limit of two hours screen time per day for all children.
