# Marsh Hill Primary School Newsletter May 24<sup>th</sup> 2024

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this newsletter finds you well.

It has been a busy and eventful half term at Marsh Hill. As you know, this term we have provided the children from Year 1 to Year 6 with the opportunity to go **horse riding**. This has been a great success and the children have thoroughly enjoyed the chance to take part. I have been very pleased to receive so much positive feedback from children and parents.

This week, as part of our school's **reading rewards scheme**, 120 children from reception to Year 6 have enjoyed watching classic stories brought to life on the big screen at the Marsh Hill cinema (with popcorn included), as a result of achieving their 'Reading Silver Award'. This means these children have consistently read at home at least three times a week for 20 weeks, and had their diary signed by an adult. Thank you for your dedication to reading, both to the pupils and your parents.

Remember there will be another opportunity for those who have not yet achieved their silver award to do so next term - as well as rewards for gold award winners! So keeeeeeeeee Reading!!!!!!!

On Tuesday, **Year 3 visited Statfold Country Park** in Tamworth. The children took part in an interactive classroom session where they found out how steam locomotives have changed over time. Olivia, who led the session, was very impressed with the children's historical knowledge and said that she had never taught a school where the children were so enthusiastic and knowledgeable about steam locomotives. We also went on a museum tour and found out the names of different parts of a steam locomotive such as the funnel, cab and footplate. To end our visit, we went for a ride on a steam train. The children were very excited and commented on how slow and bumpy it was compared to trains now.

**Year 6 visited The Birmingham Canal** this week. In spite of the rain, they had a fantastic time learning about the History of the canal network and the people – known and unknown- who helped to build them. The children enjoyed: a private boat ride to from Brindley Place to past Hockley Port to Icknield port; a workshop where they learned about the structural building of the Birmingham Canals and a guided walk along the canal. Year 6 are now ready the explore this topic further in their history lessons after the half-term break.

## School Closure for the General Election
