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
MARSH HILL PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

Asda/ Parentkind

Parentkind – the charity that supports school PTAs - have teamed up with Asda, who will be making millions of pounds available to donate to primary schools across the UK through their 'Cashpot for Schools' initiative. All you have to do is opt in through the Asda Rewards app, choose our primary school and shop and scan in store or shop online at Asda.com, up until 30th November 2024. Children will be able to visit the fayre between 2.00 – 3.00 p.m. - this will be organised within year groups. School Dinners

I would like to remind parents to book their child's school meals. Bookings can be made on the Teachers2Parents app up to midnight on the day before the meal is required. There are always at least two weeks of meal bookings available for parents to pre-book. We ask parents to book their main meal choice so we can give our excellent catering staff accurate numbers. As you can appreciate, if bookings are not made then this has implications in the correct number of meals being cooked. Text message reminders are sent out on a Thursday and Sunday. If you are having problems accessing the app, please contact one of the administration team who will help you. Please note – that menu in the case of special occasions or circumstances outside of our control - the lunch time menu for any given day may occasionally differ from the lunch menu.

Emergency Contact details

It is imperative that school hold the most up to date emergency contact details (including email addresses) for your child. If your details have changed, please contact the administration team who will give you a change of details form to complete.

The annual data checking sheets will be sent out after Christmas.

Medication in School

Please ensure that you follow the correct procedures regarding medication in school:

- School can only administer prescribed medication
- Parents/Carers must fill in the appropriate forms these are available from the school office
- The delivery and collection of medication is the responsibility of parents/carers. Medicines should be handed in and collected from the main school office.
- Medication including inhalers and epipens must be in date and of sufficient quantity

Bring it on Brum!

Bring it on Brum! is once again running FREE holiday clubs in Birmingham throughout the Christmas school holidays for young people aged 4-16 who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Activity packs and food boxes are also available as part of the Bring it on Brum! enrichment offer.

- Holiday clubs will run from Monday, 23rd December to Friday, 3rd January (excluding weekends and Bank Holidays).
- Bookings will open from Monday, 2nd December at <u>www.bringitonbrum.co.uk</u>.

To book holiday activities through the Bring it on Brum! website or directly with the holiday club, parents/carers will need a Bring it on Brum! Code. This code will be sent out via text message to all parents whose children are entitled to free school meals on 2nd December.

Mobile Phones

I would like to politely remind all parents/carers and visitors when coming into the main office/foyer that mobile phones are not to be used at any time. Thank you in advance for your co-operation in this matter.

Sickness and Diarrrhoea

If your child has got sickness or diarrhoea then they will need to be off school for 48 hours from the last time they have been sick/had diarrhoea. Please let the school office know that your child will not be attending school by 9:15am on the day of absence.
