To be eligible you must:

- be a Birmingham Resident.
- be able to demonstrate that your household is experiencing financial hardship, in particular covering food and energy costs.
- be in receipt of an appropriate benefit
- not have received a £200 grant payment in the last 12 months

If you believe that you fulfil this criteria/ please contact the school office and we will arrange a time for you to come to school for us to process the request for payment.
