Dear Parents and Carers,

A very warm welcome back and a Happy New Year to you all from everyone in school. We hope that you all had an enjoyable Christmas holiday and are looking forward to a busy and exciting term ahead. Many thanks from all the staff to parents, relatives and friends for the abundance of chocolates, cakes, biscuits, Christmas wishes and cards that made their way into school at the end of last term – they were all very much appreciated.

#### **School Uniform**

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the Marsh Hill School Uniform Policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. Parents should ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean, in good repair and is named clearly.

- White shirts or white/red polo shirts
- Red sweatshirt/cardigan
- Black or grey trousers/skirt
- In Year 6, pupils also wear a tie that is provided by the school

In terms of footwear, we believe that it can be dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles, high heels, or stiletto heels, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. Neither do we allow children to wear trainers to school; this is because we believe that this footwear is appropriate for sport or for leisure wear, but is not in keeping with the smart appearance of a school uniform. We require all children to wear black shoes.

PE

Pupils must wear their PE kit to school on the day they have PE, it must be a white t-shirt, black jogging bottoms, black trainers and their school jumper/cardigan. All jewellery should be removed for their PE day.

#### **Dinners**

In November a letter was sent out to all children who are entitled to free school meals and those children in Reception and Key Stage 1 regarding booking meals. If you haven't already, can you please return this letter with your child's meal choices on it.
