# **New Electronic Gates**

#### **SMART** watches

Please be aware that children are not allowed to wear SMART watches in school (as outlined on page 16 of the school's positive behaviour policy and page 13 of the online safety policy – both of which are available on the school website). We have had a rise in the number of children wearing SMART watches since Christmas and it is beginning to cause issues and distract children. When staff have to deal with these issues and distractions during lesson time, it reduces the amount of teaching your child is receiving.

Many smart watches now offer internet and email access, alongside standard functions of messaging, camera, video and sound recording – and staff are unable to ensure these facilities are not being used in school/on the school grounds. We take no responsibility for loss or damage to watches that are brought into school. Should children be wearing a smart watch in school it will be confiscated and an adult will be asked to collect it from the school office.

# **Collecting Children at the End of the School Day**

If you arrange for another adult to collect your child, you must let us know by contacting the school office on 0121 464 2920. Your child will not be allowed to leave with anyone else if we have not been notified.

#### **Breakfast Club**

We request that children do not bring breakfast/cereal bars or snacks with them to eat at breakfast club. Our excellent catering staff serve a variety of items including cereal, toast, juice and milk.

We have several children who have serious nut allergies that can develop into a potentially life-threatening allergic reaction and very many breakfast/cereal bars contain nuts.

#### **Data Checking Sheets**
