TT Rockstars Challenge



The Marsh Hill Marketplace Event

On Monday 10th February, we were able to support 116 of our families through our Marsh Hill Marketplace event, by providing free groceries and access to external support agencies who provide help in the areas of mental health, domestic abuse, advice around debt and difficulties with paying utility bills. There was also an opportunity to acquire pre-loved uniform items and a free breakfast for those who attended.

I know from the feedback we received that this event was welcomed and appreciated in our school community and I would like to thank Cathy Lomas, our Pastoral Manager, for

organising the event and the members of the Marsh Hill Heroes who supported her on the day to make a real and positive difference for our families.

Focus on Safeguarding - Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday of this week, school took part in Safer Internet Day. This year's event was based around the theme 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online.' The day began with a whole school assembly delivered by Ms. Cureton where children were reminded of the SMART Online Safety Rules. Throughout the day, children took part in various activities to deepen their understanding of scams and how to spot them. Here are a selection of some of the comments from the children about what they learnt.

EYFS

Tell an adult if something pops up. So they will know what to do.

Don't click on something. If it is scary tell a grown up!

We should tell our mommy or daddy if there is a problem

When I play games and someone messages me I ignore them

Year 1

Block any messages that you do not know they could be a scammer.

If you are not sure don't open or click.

If someone asks you to share your account – tell your trusted adult.

Don't keep the chat open on Roblox it can mean strangers can talk to us.

Year 2

Do not click on anything suspicious.

S for Stay safe by never giving out personal information or passwords.

M for Meeting someone who you have only been in touch with online should never be carried out.

A for Accepting files or messages from people you don't know can lead to problems.

R for Reliable: be aware that someone online might lie about who they are and information on the Internet may not be true.

T for Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone makes you feel uncomfortable or worried whilst you are online

To make a good password, you need 3 random words, one punctuation mark, one number and some capital letters.

Phishing is a type of scam that is used to steal your personal details.

I have learnt that a phishing scam is when people use bait to trick people. For example, in Roblox people could message and say that they can give you something but when you pay it, they won't actually give it to you.

If there are lots of typing errors it is likely to be a scam.

If there is a link and it doesn't belong to a proper website you should not click on it.

Protect your password from scammers.

Year 4

You should not accept any messages that 'are too good to be true' as these are scams.

Phishing scams are when people try and take information about your account, this may be your card details, password, email address etc.

If there are spelling mistakes or grammar mistakes, that means there is a high chance that you are going to get scammed.

Make sure you 'think then click.'

I know that if something strange pops up I should tell a trusted adult.

We should delete any messages that we think are scams – avoid and report.

I can remember the 'scam' acronym, I will also make sure that I do not use the same password for everything!

Year 5

Do not feel pressured to answer or click. Ask a trusted adult.

There are many scams today and new ones keep getting started. If you are not sure, do not hesitate: go and ask a trusted adult

There are many scams in the world of the internet: whether you are online or offline you are vulnerable at all times.

Year 6

We have learnt that a significant detail in a scamming message are spelling mistakes, high urgency and unrecognisable website and email addresses!

Think then click and anything you're not sure about speak to a trusted adult.

If it looks too good to be true, then it's not true.

Don't agree to anything. Just shut the link down straight away.

Signs of scam – who is the message from? Is the information in the message true? How would we check?

Phishing – when you might be tricked into sharing personal information

Later in the day we welcomed parents and carers to an online safety workshop in school. We are grateful to those who attended this event as here at Marsh Hill we recognise the importance of all of working and joining together to make the internet a safer and better place for all our children and young people.
