Healthy Eating and Nut Free Food Items

In last week's newsletter, I asked parents and carers to please not send their children to school with foods or confectionery containing nuts, and explained the reasons for this were to safeguard and protect all our children and particularly those within our school community who suffer from nut allergies. Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. Unfortunately, children are still bringing in foods that contain nuts. As a result, yesterday your child will have brought home a letter outlining school's stance on this issue moving forward.

Year 6 Penny Wars

As part of the mathematics curriculum at Marsh Hill Primary School, Year 6 are getting ready for an exhilarating competition that will put their maths skills to the test in the most thrilling and creative way possible - it's time for the Penny Wars!

Each team (class) will have their own jar to fill with as many pennies (including 2p coins) as possible, but watch out - because silver coins have the power to subtract from your total! It will take savvy budgeting, smart finance allocation, estimation and maybe a few sneaky espionage missions to sabotage the other teams to come out on top.

Who will conquer the copper mountain and clinch the title of Penny War champion? The showdown is about to begin!

Penny Wars will begin on Monday, 17th March, 2025.

Penny Wars Rules:

To play Penny Wars, each team starts with a large empty jar. The goal is to have the most points when the game ends. Pennies (including 2p coins) are worth positive points, while silver coins (5p, 10p, 25p) are worth negative points.

Pennies placed in your own team's jar count as +1 point each. Silver coins placed in another team's jar count as negative points for them: 5p = -5 points, 10p = -10 points etc

The game ends on Friday, 28th March 2025 and all the coins are counted up to determine the team's total points.

Pennies in your jar boost your score, while silver coins in your jar reduce your score. The team with the highest score at the end wins the game. Teams can sabotage each other by dropping silver coins into each other's jars. The strategic element is deciding where to place your coins - pennies in your own jar to boost your score or silver coins in other jars to lower theirs.

The game creates an exciting and competitive atmosphere as the jars fill up and teams battle to gain the lead before time runs out.

Thank you to Ms. Morrison for this innovative and fun approach to developing maths skills.
