Measles

On Tuesday of this week your child brought home a letter regarding a case of measles at school. This letter was sent to you on the advice of the West Midlands Health Protection Team at UKHSA (UK Health Security Agency). The letter refers to the importance of ensuring your child has had the MMR vaccine. The MMR vaccine gives you and your family protection against catching measles. If you've missed any doses it's not too late to catch up. If you are unsure if you or your child are up to date, check your child's red book or GP records and make an appointment to catch up any missed doses. If you did not receive the letter, then please pick up a copy from the school office.

EYFS Writing Workshop

Thank you to all our parents and carers who attended the Reception Writing Workshop on Tuesday morning. It was great to see so many families in school supporting their child and the children had a wonderful time with their loved ones.
